Minimum Adults Needed: 12 competent adults

Location: Camp wide

Supervisors: Instructors and competent supervisors

- It is expected that your organisation will have briefed supervisors as to any special needs/at risk participants (e.g. a severe bee-sting allergy, epilepsy).
