## Activity: Air Rifles

**Risk Level:** Medium

**Recommended Adult:Child Ratio:** 1:6

**Location:** Air Rifles Range

**Supervisors:** Parent Helpers/Teacher(s)

### Important Information for Supervisors of Activity Groups:

- ⇒ The children and their safety is **your** responsibility for the entire duration of the session. Do not allow any child to leave the group without your permission.
- ⇒ Please ensure your cellphone is off & attention is on the children at all times.
- ⇒ Please ensure you are acquainted with the **Activity Instructions** and the **RAMS** form for your activity prior to beginning the session.
- ⇒ It is expected that your organisation will have briefed supervisors as to any special needs/ at risk children (e.g. a severe bee-sting allergy, epilepsy).
- ⇒ If you have any concerns about the activity, the equipment or your level of ability in regard to this activity, please speak with One Big Adventure staff immediately.
- ⇒ If the weather changes during a session it is your responsibility to make a decision about whether it is safe to continue the activity, or stop it if necessary.
- ⇒ Normal precautions for child safety apply such as:
  - ◆ Ensure adequate clothing and footwear are worn especially if outdoors.
  - ◆ Maintain group control at all times.
  - ◆ Be aware of emergency procedures.
  - ◆ Know who your First Aid Officer for the group is and their location.
- ⇒ Encourage full group participation and have fun together!

**Please note: Any firing of the air rifles other than on the air rifle range inside the tubes will result in that person being requested to leave Carey Park**

## Activity: Air Rifles

- ◆ The **RAMS** outlined below are for hazards that could result in serious illness, injury and/ or death. These hazards are specifically related to use of One Big Adventure activities and equipment.
- ◆ Risks associated with normal daily life have not been included (such as bee stings, sunburn, etc.) as it is expected that all groups will apply normal precautions to avoid these and to address them if need be.

Equipment		
Risks	Causing Factors	Normal Operations
Injury or Death	Hit by gun pellet	No one is allowed in the target area while shooting is in progress. No one is allowed to touch the guns while retrieving targets. Always point guns away from people including when being loaded. Safety goggles are to be worn while shooting. Only adults are to load guns
	Equipment faulty/risky	Equipment and target area regularly undergo maintenance

People		
Risks	Causing Factors	Normal Operations
Injury	Loss of group control/ misbehavior	Adequate Adult:Child ratios
	Failure to follow instructions of use - (either participants or adults)	Ensure supervisors are trained by staff on correct usage of equipment
	Other people wandering into target area	Ensure 'WAIT' signs are clearly visible around entrance to target area
	Gear left out unsupervised	It is written on Instruction sheets and explained to adults on training to bring gear back to the activities office between sessions.

### EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

1. Stop the activity
2. Assess the situation and the group safety as well as your own
3. Administer first aid and seek further treatment if necessary
4. Fill in Accident Report Sheet with your First Aid Officer (See Staff)
